REPORT OF THE CELEBRATION OF REMNA NI 2023

1. INTRODUCTION

Remna Ni is celebrated on June 30 every year to honour the signing of the Mizoram Peace Accord. On June 30, 2023, Mizoram celebrated the 37th anniversary of the signing of the Mizoram Peace Accord. The accord was a historic agreement between the Government of India and the Mizo National Front (MNF), which ended two decades of insurgency in the state.

In 1959, Mizoram experienced a devastating famine known as 'mautam'. This is an ecological phenomenon that occurs every 48 years and it is caused by the flowering of the bamboo species Melocanna baccifera. When the bamboo flowers, it produces a large number of seeds, which attract black rats. The rats then feast on the seeds, which leads to a boom in their population. When the bamboo seeds run out, the rats start eating stored grain, which causes widespread famine.

Elderly Mizos who had an experience of the 'mautam' of 1911 tried to warn the government of Assam, but their warnings were neglected and considered as superstitions. The Central Government and Assam Government were unable or unwilling to provide relief, so a Mizo activist Pu Laldenga founded the Mizo National Famine Front to help the affected communities. The Mizo National Famine Front soon transformed into a political party, the Mizo National Front (MNF). In 1966, the MNF declared independence from India and started an armed uprising.

The Indian Government quickly suppressed the revolt, but the MNF continued to fight for independence for another 20 years. The 'mautam' famine and the MNF insurgency were both caused by the same underlying problem: the lack of political representation for the Mizos. The Mizos had long felt that they were being neglected by the Indian government, and the 'mautam' famine only inflamed these feelings. The MNF insurgency was an attempt to gain greater autonomy for the Mizos, and it ultimately succeeded in 1986, when the Indian government signed a peace agreement with the MNF.

The accord was signed on June 30, 1986, in New Delhi by the Home Secretary, Government of India, Pu Lalkhama, Chief Secretary, Government of Mizoram and the leader of the MNF, Laldenga. The accord stipulated that the MNF would surrender its arms and ammunition, and cut its ties with other insurgent organizations.

The signing of the Mizoram Peace Accord was a major turning point in the State's history. It brought an end to the violence and bloodshed that had plagued Mizoram for two decades, and it paved the way for the state's eventual development and progress.

The Mizoram Accord reads: "With a view to restoring peace and normalcy in Mizoram, the MNF Party, in their part undertake within the agreed time-frame, to bring out all underground personnel of the MNF with their arms, ammunitions, and equipments, to ensure their return to civil life, to abjure violence and generally to help in the process of restoration of normalcy."

"The modalities of bringing out all underground personnel and the deposit of arms, ammunitions and equipments will be as worked out. The implementation of the foregoing will be under the supervision of the Central Government," it added.



The Mizoram Peace Accord has been credited with bringing peace and stability to Mizoram. The state has since enjoyed a period of sustained economic growth and development. The accord has also served as a model for other peace processes in India and other parts of the world.

3. MEETINGS OF THE STATE LEVEL COMMITTEE:

3.1 First Meeting

The first meeting of the State Level Committee was held on 8th May 2023 under the chairmanship of Dr Renu Sharma, Chief Secretary, Government of Mizoram. The following decisions and responsibilities were made:

1. Observation of Remna Ni: Remna Ni will be observed in the State and the Districts Headquarters on 30.06.2023 (Friday). Details of the programme at the State level will be chalked out by GAD and the Deputy Commissioners in their respective districts.

(Action: GAD/All DCs)

2. Health Camps: Free health camps will be organized at the State level as well as in all the Districts on 30.06.2023.

(Action: Health & Family Welfare Deptt.)

3. Digital Flyer & Short video making Competition: Digital Flyer & Short video making Competition on the theme 'Cleanliness for Peace and Prosperity' will be organized and prize distribution for the competitions will be held on Remna Ni during the main programme.

(Action: UD & PA Deptt.)

4. Cleanliness Drive: Cleanliness Drive on the theme 'Clean Mizoram for Peace & Prosperity' will be organized by UD & PA Department on Remna Ni i.e., 30.06.2023. The department is requested to ensure maximum community participation including women and children

(Action: UD & PA Deptt.)

5. Peace Walk: Peace Walk at the State level will be organized by Yuva Tourism Club on Remna Ni. Similarly, all DCs may also organize Peace Walk in their respective District headquarters

(Action: Tourism Department/All DCs)

6. Blood Donation: To mark the 37th year of Remna Ni, Mizoram Police will donate 37 units of blood from each district.

(Action: Mizoram Police)

7. Blood Donation Camp: Blood Donation camp may be held on Remna Ni in consultation with Central YMA and Association for Voluntary Blood Donation (AVBD)

(Action: GAD/YMA/AVBD)

8. Band Display: Display of Mizoram Police Band Party at public places will be organized in celebration of Remna Ni on 30.06.2023.

(Action: Mizoram Police)



9. Tree Plantation: EF & CC Department will provide saplings for plantation of trees in observation of Remna Ni.

(Action: EF&CC Department.)

10.Painting Competition & Photography Contest: Painting competition on the motifs of peace and photography competition will be organized by I & PR Department. Prize distribution for the competitions will be held on Remna Ni during the main function.

(Action: I & PR Department)

11.Quiz and essay competition: School Education Department will organize Inter-School Quiz Competition and Essay competition particularly on the topic of the history of Mizoram leading up to the signing of Peace Accord in 1986. The Competition may be organized for Secondary/Higher Secondary Schools at the District level all the Districts. Prize distribution for the competitions will be held on Remna Ni during the main function both at the State Level and also at the District Level

(Action: All DCs/School Education Department)

12.MUP: MUP is requested to perform one special item in the main function to be held on 30.06.2023.

(Action:MUP)

13.YMA Chhang: In order to maximize participation at the community level, activities for YMA Chhang may be chalked out in consultation with Central YMA.

(Action: GAD/YMA)

3.2 Second Meeting (District Level Committees)

The Second Meeting was chaired by Pu K Lalthawmmawia, Commissioner & Secretary, General Administration Department on hybrid mode with Deputy Commissioners of the District joining the meeting through Video Conference. The Chairman welcomed the members and apprised them of the urgency of the meeting as several activities will be conducted on the run up to Remna Ni. The members were sensitized on the activities to be held at the state level which are expected to be replicated at the district level according to their convenience. It was reiterated that the departments involved are to align prevailing schemes/activities under their department with activities for Remna Ni.

Following are the points which may be taken up at the district level in connection with Remna Ni:

1. Health Camps: Free health camps will be organized by Health &Family Welfare Department in all the Districts on 30.06.2023 preferably in the suburbs of the district headquarters and targeting the less privileged sections of the society. Deputy Commissioners are requested to facilitate the health camps in their respective districts.

2. Digital Flyer & Short video making Competition: Digital Flyer & Short video making Competition on the theme 'Cleanliness for Peace and Prosperity' will be organized by



UD & PA Department. The same may be organized at the district level in consultation with the respective DUDO.

3. Cleanliness Drive: Cleanliness Drive on the theme 'Clean Mizoram for Peace & Prosperity' will also be organized by UD & PA Department during the run-up to Remna Ni i.e., 30.06.2023. All DCs are requested to ensure maximum community participation including women and children at the district level.

4. Peace Walk: Peace Walk at the State level will be organized by Yuva Tourism Club on Remna Ni. Similarly, all DCs may also organize Peace Walk in their respective District headquarters in coordination with other departments including Sports & Youth Services and School Education Department.

5. Blood Donation Camp: Blood Donation camp may be held as part of celebration of Remna Ni in coordination with NGOs. Actual date and detailed programme may be finalized at the District level depending on the availability of blood banks and other factors.

6. Tree plantation: Although Green Mizoram Day will be observed in the month of June, 2023, all DCs are requested to liaise with EF&CC Department and undertake tree plantation on the occasion of Remna Ni.

7. Painting Competition & Photography Exhibition: Painting competition on the motifs of peace and photography exhibition will be organized by 1&PR Department at the State level. The same may be explored by the DCs.

8. Quiz and essay competition: School Education Department will organize Quiz competition with primary focus on the political history of Mizoram. Similarly, essay organized for organized on the topic related to peace. The Competition may be organized on the topic related to peace. The competition may be organized for Secondary/Higher Secondary Schools at the District level. The main topic, language etc may be decided at the district level. All DCs are requested to facilitate the competition organized by the concerned Department.

The Chairman advised all the Deputy Commissioners to devise and customize activities suitable for their districts depending on their capacities and resources at their disposal.

All members are requested to plan the activities where competitions are involved so that prize distribution can be held during the main function at the district headquarters on Remna Ni i.e., 30.06.2023.

All districts are required to submit their respective Budget estimates for the conduct of Remna Ni by the evening of 15.05.2023 and latest by 16.05.2023 during the first hour.

3.3 Third Meeting:

The third meeting was held on 16th May 2023 and it was presided over by Pu K. Lalthawmmawia, Commissioner & Secretary, GAD. The Chairman welcomed the members and explained that the meeting on Remna Ni is convened to chalk out the details of activities decided at the State Level meeting held under the Chairmanship of the Chief Secretary to the



Govt. of Mizoram. After discussions and deliberations the following points are decided by the meeting.

1. Blood Donation Camp: Blood Donation Camp will be jointly organized by Central YMÂ and Association for Voluntary Blood Donation (AVBD). The month of June, 2023 will be designated as 'Blood Donation Month for Aizawl city. An opening ceremony to flag off the programme will be held on 1st June, 2023 at Dawrpui Multipurpose Hall. Programme for the function will be prepared by AVBD and submit it to GAD at the earliest along with expenditure requirements. They will also make an appeal to all target groups like the Police, YMA, KTP, TKP, etc. to donate blood generously as part of celebration of Remna Ni within this period. GAD will notify the Blood Banks in advance about the programme. In the District Headquarters, the programme for blood donation camp will be organised by the respective Deputy Commissioners taking due consideration of factors like availability of blood banks and their capacity, normal requirement of blood in the hospitals, etc.

(Action: GAD, All DC, Central YMA, AVBD)

2. Band Display: As decided in the meeting held on 08.05.2023, Mizoram Police will display band party at selected locations within Aizawl City on Remna Ni. It was also decided that Govt. Mizo High School band party be invited to perform on the occasion. All band parties will perform at the selected locations on Remna Ni starting at 1:00 PM as below:

a) 1st MAP will display their Brass band at Sikulpuikawn and will move to Millenium Centre.

b) 3rd MAP will display their Pipe band at Temple Square and will move to Thuampui.

c) Govt. Mizo High School band party will perform at Chanmari Kawn. Certificate of Appreciation will be given to all the participants by GAD.

(Action: GAD, Mizoram Police, School Education Department)

3. Tree Plantation: Tree Plantation Drive will be organized in the run up to Remna Ni/on Remna Ni itself both at the State Level as well as in all the District Headquarters. EF&CC Department is requested to set aside saplings to be planted on the occasion of Remna Ni. In this regard following decisions are made:

- **a)** GAD will submit the requisite number of saplings to EF&CC Department
- **b)** EF & CC Department will organize the plantation of tree saplings including site preparation at the State as well as the district level.
- **c)** GAD will liaise with the department for site selection.
- **d)** Refreshment and other requirements on the day of ceremonial plantation by the State dignitaries will be arranged by GAD.
- **e)** Deputy Commissioners will liaise with EF&CC Department at the District level in their respective District Headquarters for organizing tree plantation.

(Action: GAD, EF&CC Dept., All DCs)

4. Painting Competition and Photography Exhibition: Photography contest as decided in the previous meeting will be changed to Photography Exhibition on the convenience of the concerned department. The department was requested to make arrangement for exhibition of



Photographs at least 2 days prior to Remna Ni at Vanapa Hall which will be kept on display till 30.06.2023.

State Level Painting competition will be conducted as decided. All necessary expenditure will be borne by the department. District Level Committees may decide conducting of painting competition and photography exhibition at the District Level within their respective budgets.

(Action: I & PR Deptt, All DCs)

5. Quiz and Essay Competition: School Education Department reported that District Level Quiz and Essay Competition will be conducted for High Schools/Higher Secondary Schools in all the Districts. All expenses including Cash Prize and Certificates for the winners will be met from Community Mobilization Fund under Samagra Shiksha Abhiyan. Quiz competition will be conducted for Secondary School students. The theme for the competition will be the Political History of Mizoram: 1947 - 1987. Question bank will be prepared at the State and the competition for all the districts will be held at the same day and at the same time.

Essay Competition will be held for Higher Secondary School students and will be written on the spot. Details of essay competition are yet to be finalized

(Action: School Education Dept., All DCs)

6. Peace Walk: Tourism department reported that most of the Higher Secondary Schools and Colleges have Yuva Tourism Club. Details of the programme to be held on Remna Ni will be chalked out by the department with intimation to GAD. District Level Committees may also organize Peace Walk in their respective District Headquarters on Remna Ni.

(Action: Tourism Dept., All DCs)

7. Programme: The programme for the celebration of Remna Ni was discussed, and the following items are proposed for inclusion in the programme.

a. Venue & Time: The venue for the celebration of Remna Ni shall be at Vanapa Hall and the function will start at 11:00 AM on 30.06.2023.

b. Compere: Director, I & PR Department will designate two suitable MIS Officers for the smooth flow of the programme.

(Action:I & PR Dept.)

c. Invitees: The list of invitees may be confined as follows:

1. Members of Parliament (Lok Sabha & Rajya Sabha), all Ministers, Ministers of State, Speaker, Deputy Speaker, Deputy Chief Whip, MLAs and Vice Chairman of various Boards, Chairmen and Members of various Commissions, statutory bodies, Boards and Corporations.

2. Government officials not below the rank of Deputy Secretary & equivalent may attend. All Administrative Heads and Head of Departments will be responsible for attendance of officers under their establishment. GAD will issue suitable instructions in this regard.

f. Media Coverage: Director, I & PR Departmet shall arrange for media coverage of all the activities done on the occasion of Remna Ni and their wide publicity on all media platforms. She shall also make arrangement for live streaming of the main event to be held on 30.06.2023.

g. Security: S.P Security will be in charge of Security inside the venue for the day. He may arrange Anti-Sabotage checking and Door Frame Metal Detector as well as security personnel as may be required. Similarly, S.P Aizawl will be responsible for security arrangement around the venue.

(Action: S.P Security/S.P, Aizawl)

h. Traffic: S.P Traffic will be in charge of traffic management in and around the venue.

(Action: S.P Traffic)



i. Bouquet Presentation, Refreshment & Venue Decoration: Bouquet presentation, Refreshment & Venue Decoration will be arranged by GAD

j. Sanitation: Director, UD & PA may ensure that the venue is swept clean before and after the event.

4. BLOOD DONATION

4.1 Inauguration of month long mega blood donation drive in Aizawl

The General Administration Department, Government of Mizoram, in collaboration with the Association for Voluntary Blood Donation (AVBD) and the Central YMA, conducted a monthlong mega blood donation drive in June 2023 to commemorate Remna Ni. The inaugural function was held on 1st June 2023 (Thursday) at Dawrpui Multipurpose Hall, with the presence of Pu Zoramthanga, Chief Minister of Mizoram as the Chief Guest.



In his inaugural address, the Chief Minister emphasized the importance of the mega blood donation camp as an opportunity to be a blessing to those in need. He emphasized the significance of Remna Ni, which marks the day when the Mizoram Peace Accord was signed. The Chief Minister mentioned that during the period of insurgency, many young people made great sacrifices, giving up their lives for the cause. He acknowledged that the entire state of Mizoram endured immense suffering during that challenging time. The Chief Minister stated that the region, which was once the most tumultuous in the entire North East, has now become the most peaceful state. He expressed that the challenges Mizoram faced in the past have prepared its people to empathize with others who are going through difficulties, making them ever ready to extend help to those in need. He emphasized that it is fitting to celebrate Remna Ni and honour those who sacrificed their lives by donating blood to save the lives of others. The Chief Minister made a heartfelt appeal to the public to come forward and donate blood, highlighting the importance of this act of generosity and compassion.

Pu K. Lalthawmmawia, Commissioner & Secretary, General Administration Departmenyt also addressed the gathering, emphasizing the importance of Remna Ni and reflecting on the challenges faced by the people during the insurgency period. He highlighted the transformative journey towards development that began with the signing of the peace accord. He urged the



people to cherish, preserve and nurture peace, emphasizing its value and the need to safeguard it. The Secretary announced that the departments under the Govt. of Mizoram, in collaboration with affiliated associations and societies will celebrate Remna Ni by conducting a series of activities and events, during the month of June. The Mega Blood Donation Month is one of the significant events included in the celebration, he added.



Pu R. Lalngheta, President, Central YMA, appealed to the members of the YMA to actively take part in the blood donation drive and contribute to saving the lives of patients in need. Recognizing the importance of blood donation as a noble act, he emphasized that it is crucial for donors to be in good health and free from any substance addiction. He specifically focused on the issue of drug and alcohol addiction, urging young people and YMA members to stay away from such harmful substances and prioritize their well-being. He emphasized the significance of taking care of one's health and being able to contribute to society in meaningful ways, including through blood donation.

Pu C. Lalnunnema , AVBD President presided over the inaugural event, and high school students aged 18 and above initiated the blood donation camp by donating blood.

The month-long celebration of Remna Ni will include various activities such as district-level essay writing competition for Higher Secondary students, painting and photo exhibition by the I & PR Department, tree sapling planting by the Forests Department, cleanliness drives at all District Headquarters by UD & PA, digital flyer and short video competitions, and blood donation drives in all districts. **(Input from I & PR Department)**

4.2 Blood Donation Report

As decided in the State Level Meeting on Celebration of Remna Ni, 2023 held under the chairmanship of Chief Secretary on 8th May, 2023 (Monday), blood donation as part of celebration of Remna Ni was organized in collaboration with Association for Blood Donation and Central YMA. The State Government sanctioned fund amounting to Rs. 2 lakhs for the said purpose.

The month of June, 2023 was declared as Blood Donation Month for Aizawl and an inaugural function of the designated month was held on 1st June, 2023 (Thursday) at Dawrpui Multipurpose Hall.P uZoramthanga, Hon'ble Chief Minister graced the function as Chief Guest. Pu C.Lalnunnema, President, AVBD chaired the function and welcomed the invitees for the event. Pu K.Lalthawmmawia, Commissioner & Secretary, General Administration Department

5. TREE PLANTATION DRIVE

Pu Zoramthanga , Hon'ble Chief Minister led the ceremonial tree sapling plantation in Aizawl on 28th June 2023 (Wednesday) to commemorate the signing of the historic Mizo Peace Accord. In a simple ceremony at an open gym in the Secretariat Complex, Hon'ble Chief Minister said the time-tested peace accord, signed between the Centre and the MNF on June 30, 1986, had brought peace and tranquility in the state, bringing an end to the State's troubled days.



Besides Dr Renu Sharma, the Chief Secretary, the occasion was also attended by Pu Navin Kumar Choudhary, Principal Secretary, EF & CC Department, Pu RK Singh, Principal Chief Conservator of Forest, Pu K. Lalthawmmawia, Commissioner & Secretary, General Administration Department as well as other important dignitaries and officials of the state.

In his commemorative speech, the Hon'ble Chief Minister re-iterated that the time-tested Peace Accord, signed between the Govt. of India and the MNF on 30th June, 1986, had brought bliss and tranquility in the state and that the troubled days of Mizoram had come to an end. Stating the fact that for 20 years before the signing of the Accord, Mizoram was the most troubled and unsettled state not only in the north-east India but the whole of South-East Asia, he added that the efforts put forward by both the Government of India and Mizo National Front (MNF) had been fruitful with Mizoram now having the distinction of being the most peaceful state in India and being exemplary in maintaining and restoring lasting peace.

Commending the EF & CC Department for selecting the Thlado tree sapling for plantation drive, he pointed out that the Thlado tree's flower is called 'Chawnpui' by the Mizos and was one of the main materials used for constructing houses by the forefathers, and was very befitting to plant the Thlado on the occasion of commemorating the abiding peace in Mizoram. He reaffirmed the need to combat climate change in the present world, where the most unfortunate incidents often occur as a result of environment deterioration and added that Mizoram also has a lot to play in protecting the environment. The Chief Guest also remarked that peace is the most precious commodity that Mizoram has to export to the world, which looked upon her with awe and



admiration for the simple yet happy and peaceful lifestyle practiced in Mizo society. He also touched upon the present refugees and internally displaced persons who saw Mizoram as a mental and physical haven and implored the gathering as well as the people of Mizoram to have humanitarian approach in dealing with them and beseeched them to do their best to preserve peace in Mizoram.



Dr. Renu Sharma, Chief Secretary and Pu K. Lalthawmmawia, Commissioner & Secretary, General Administration Department also delivered short speeches on the occasion.

Pu RK Singh, Principal Chief Conservator of Forest gifted a sapling each to the Chief Guest and Chief Secretary to congratulate them on the ceremonial tree planting. The Chief Guest also released 37 balloons to commemorate 37 years of peace and also planted the thlado saplings near the open gym MINECO along with other officials. **(Input from I & PR Department)**

6. PEACE WALK

8. STATE LEVEL FUNCTION

The State level function of the 37th Remna Ni was held at Vanapa Hall in Aizawl which was organized by General Administration Department. Pu Zoramthanga, Hon'ble Chief Minister graced the function as Chief Guest.

In his speech, Pu Zoramthanga, Hon'ble Chief Minister termed the peace accord as "the most timetested exemplary accord not only in the country but also in the world". He also stated that the successful Mizoram peace accord can serve as a "model of peace" for "many neighbouring states and countries".

Pu Zoramthanga, Hon'ble Chief Minister also greeted the people of the state on the occasion of the 37th anniversary of the signing Mizoram peace accord.



The Chief Guest started his speech with the history of Mizo national movement due to indifferent treatment of the then Assam Government which had led many into starvation due to mautam famine. He said that Mizoram had been part of the British Empire since 1870. Post-independence, it was made a part of Assam, and in 1952 a subsidiary government called the Lushai Hills District



was created under Assam, which basically covered the later Mizoram. But many opposed this, as the Mizo people were also spread in Manipur and Burma. They demanded freedom or to join Burma. The feeling of alienation seeped in by 1959 when Mizoram was facing a famine, and authorities in Assam and the Indian authorities, in general, seemed negligent.

A local social organization was then set up in 1960 for relief works, which later became the Mizo National Front (MNF). It turned into a full-fledged political party in 1961 with Laldenga as President. Their goal was to create a separate independent state that would encompass all the Mizo tribes in the territories of Tripura, Manipur and Cachar districts of Assam under a single political government. The MNF created its armed wing, the Mizo National Army and launched Operation Jericho, under which it declared independence from India on 1 March 1966.

The government, in turn, declared Lushai Hills District as a disturbed area, banned MNF as a terror organization under the Defence of India Rule and deployed the Indian Army. In 1967, AFSPA was applied to the state.

Lauding the contributions made by Mizo people, NGOs, Churches and Civil Societies, Pu Zoramthanga, Hon'ble Chief Minister said that the historic Mizoram Peace Accord signed in 1986 was the most time-tested exemplary accord not only in the country but also in the world, which have lasted till date; since then, Mizoram accord has become an exemplary peace accord. Many neighbouring states and countries also take it as a model of peace.

He further said that 'Today, I implore my fellow Mizos to take pride in this gift of God we received, and to preserve it for generations to come. Only through PEACE can we have real and stable growth and development".

Dr Renu Sharma, Chief Secretary, Government of Mizoram who was the chairman for the function also focused on the significance of Remna Ni which is celebrated every year on June 30 to remind the people of Mizoram of the struggles and sacrifices made by the Mizo people during the two long decades of insurgency between 1966 and 1986.

She further added that as Mizoram celebrates the 37th anniversary of this Peace Agreement, the Mizoram Peace Accord has been cited internationally as a model, because of its determination to address the root causes of the conflict and its central focus on the rights and dignity of the indigenous people. All parts of the agreement in the Peace Accord have been implemented by the successive governments, as they are interrelated and thus necessary to achieve the goals.

The Peace Accord signed in 1986 between the Government of India and the Mizo National Front brought peace and tranquility here. It was a historic moment when the new State was inaugurated on February 20, 1987.

She conveyed her sincere appreciation and gratitude to the people of Mizoram for making a sacrifice which has enabled the Peace Accord to become a reality. The sustenance of peace in Mizoram was due to social administrative system of the Mizos which was largely shaped by civil society organizations that the agreement was possible only because of the people of Mizoram

She also reminded the youngsters to remember the total involvement of those people which gave an extra-ordinary momentum to the political process, as a result of which the State



witnessed the restoration of peace and order and ultimately becoming the most peaceful state in India. So, this is a tribute to the people of Mizoram who made sacrifices with determination to march ahead in the fields of socio-economic development as we are today along with the rest of the country.

12.2 SAIHA DISTRICT

In pursuance of the resolution of the meeting for celebration of Remna Ni 2023 under the chairmanship of Pu K Lalthawmmawia, Commissioner & Secretary, General Administration Department on 16.05.2023, Siaha District had organized a grand celebration of Remna Ni 2023 in various ways. Activities undertaken for the celebration and commemoration of the crucial day i.e June 30 on which a significant accord was signed between the Government of India and Mizo National Front back in 1986 to bring the 20-year long insurgency in Mizoram to an end are given below –

1. A meeting was held on 1st June, 2023 to chalk out tentative programme and course of actions to make sure that celebration of Remna Ni was truly worthwhile and remarkable. The meeting saw the overwhelming attendance of Head of Departments/Offices and other stakeholders which could be taken as a proof of enthusiasm and keenness amongst the officials and the public.



2. Another round of meeting was held on 21st June, 2023 to oversee the preparatory activities undertaken and to see if changes and modification had been required in the course of organizing the event. In the meeting, decision of the government was highlighted that Pu Robert Romawia Royte, Hon'ble Minister of State for S&YS and DC&MA, etc had been scheduled to grace
